Who should take it?

If you're an incoming degree seeking student at Palm Beach State College, you may need to take the PERT. | [See exemption list](#)

Non-Palm Beach State students planning to attend another school can take the PERT at a PBSC Test Center. A test fee is required in the Cashiers Office prior to taking the test.

Do I need an appointment?

Yes, please check the [Test Center Appointment](#) page for testing availability.

Is there a fee?

Possibly. For new PBSC students, the initial exam is included in your Application Fee. Should you need to retake the exam or you're not a new student, the fee would apply. | [View testing fees](#)

What else do I need to know?

The PERT is comprised of three sections: Reading, Writing Skills (English) and Math. There are 30 questions per placement sub-test. The PERT is an untimed test but each test section should be completed within the same school day.

Students may not retake the PERT on the same day and remediation is required prior to the 3rd attempt. The testing fee must be paid for each retake. Printed proof of remediation must be presented to the Test Center staff.

Acceptable remediation sites:

Students required to take the ESL must take the ESL before taking the PERT a second time.

Students currently enrolled in developmental courses cannot retest in the same subject area until the end of the current term.

After the 3rd attempt, students cannot retake the PERT until the scores have expired. Test scores are valid for two years from the date the test was taken.
